Founded in 1972, Hartford Chorale is a volunteer, not-for-profit organization committed to presenting beautiful masterpieces of great choral art throughout southern New England and beyond.

The Chorale performs with the Hartford Symphony Orchestra, and also collaborates with the New Haven Symphony, Waterbury Symphony, The Yale School of Music, The Hartt School, Opera Theater of Connecticut, and other choruses, orchestras and ensembles throughout the region.

Its dedicated members are avocational singers with professionalquality voices and include musicians, teachers, students, doctors, lawyers, engineers and many more from all walks of life. They are supported by a small core of professional vocalists. They live throughout Connecticut and Massachusetts, and work in many of the corporations in the region.

Hartford Chorale is governed by a volunteer board, a diverse and impressive group of individuals with a wide range of business and musical experiences. They have a singular vision to keep the Chorale moving forward using our Four-Point Chorale Strategic Planning Framework. Many of the board members also sing in the Chorale.

Community

Approximately 6,000 audience members attend Chorale performances each season in concert halls and churches throughout Connecticut. Potential members are introduced to the Chorale through open rehearsals, and public 'conclaves' provide community enrichment and educational experiences. The Chorale participates in benefit concerts and local festivals - including *Make Music Hartford*, and tours internationally, a highlight of the Chorale singing experience.

The Chorale performs works ranging in style from quiet acapella motets to great oratorios and everything in between – classic to contemporary. Some of our 'greatest hits' include:

Bach – St. John Passion, Mass in B Minor, Christmas Oratorio Beethoven – Missa Solemnis, Symphony No. 9 (Choral), Mass in C Brahms – Requiem (under the baton of Robert Shaw in 1989) Brubeck – Joy in the Morning Handel – Messiah (an almost annual event) McCartney – Liverpool Oratorio Mozart - Requiem, Mass in C Orff – Carmina Burana

From 1988 until 1993, he was Chorus Master for the Connecticut Opera Association. From 1974 until 2014, he served as Artistic Director of CONCORA. He has earned numerous awards recognizing his contributions to the arts in greater Hartford and beyond.

Assistant Music Director, Jack Anthony Pott, is a highly respected soloist, voice teacher, clinician and conductor throughout the region. He has been a featured tenor soloist with many ensembles in Connecticut. In addition, he
